

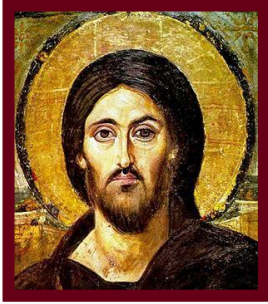

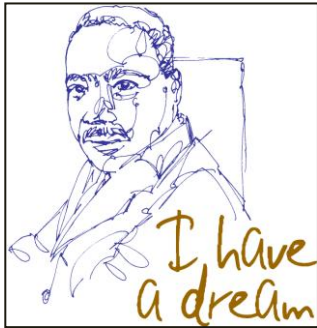
We welcome our visitors.

Music This Sunday



In honor of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., the Cathedral Singers will sing "*Keep your eyes on the Prize.*" This civil rights song was an adaptation of the spiritual "Hold on! Keep your hand on the gospel plow" by Alice Wine for the Student Non-violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) in the 1960's. Along with other spirituals with updated lyrics, this music was an important part of galvanizing the civil rights movement, recalling the original context of the sacred songs of the slaves as the voice of communal solidarity and social protest. One of our new Choral Scholars, Rocky Sellers, will also sing Harry T. Burleigh's arrangement of "Deep River" as our meditation after communion. For our closing hymn, we will all sing out together the historic anthem "Lift every voice and sing."
