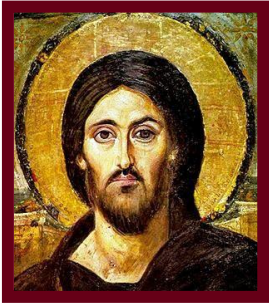

MUSIC THIS SUNDAY – The anthem for this Sunday is from a set valedictory set of choral settings by C. Hubert Parry called *Songs of Farewell*. Written in the last decade of his life, these pieces are variably called "part-songs" (to be sung one voice to a part in the home) or motets (sacred anthems to be sung in church). Given Parry's own humanist leanings, they were most likely intended for non-liturgical use and are most frequently performed today in concert by chamber choirs.

The original title of the poem by the 17th century metaphysical poet Henry Vaughan was "Peace," no doubt inspired by the civil war that consumed Britain during his lifetime. On this Trinity Sunday the poet and composer may help us grasp this elusive but central element of our faith: through the birth and death of Jesus, "Thy gracious friend," the continuity of this "Sweet Peace" through the "flower of peace, the rose," reminding us of their common source in the "One who never changes," as manifest in the trinitarian "Thy God, thy Life, thy Cure."
